

Exam Respiratory System

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Start by examining the trachea for deviation and for tug. Placing your index and ring finger of the right hand on the head of each clavicle, use the middle finger of the same hand to palpate the trachea in the sternal notch. Roll you finger across the trachea in the axial (horizontal) plane to assess for deviation.

Examination Inspection. General inspection: Evidence of respiratory distress at rest or when walking - eg, obvious breathlessness, talking in short phrases rather than full sentences, use of accessory muscles, exhalation with pursed lips. Evidence of other respiratory symptoms - eg, cough, audible wheeze.

The four steps of the respiratory exam are inspection, palpation, percussion, and auscultation of respiratory sounds, normally first carried out from the back of the chest.
